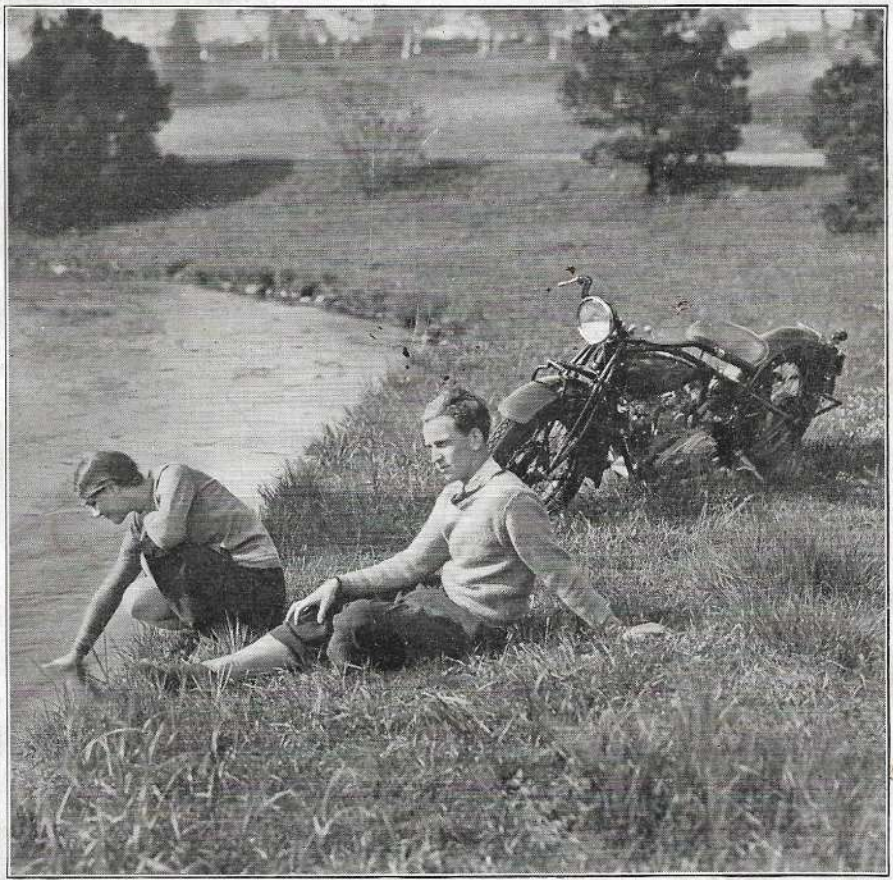

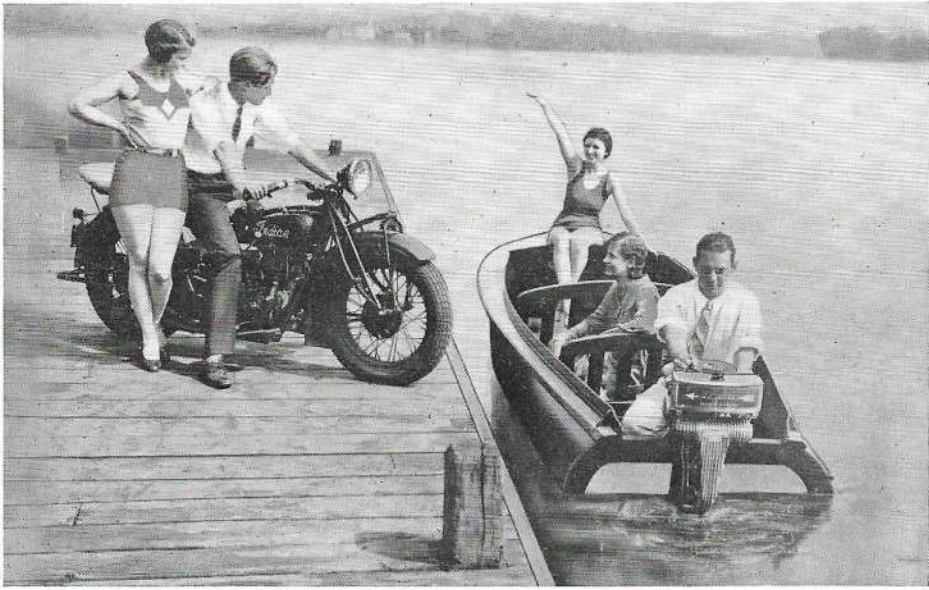

### 187,212 Miles on a Prince

Out at Hertzogville in South Africa, Lieut. W. J. A. Strauss recently completed 187,212 miles on his INDIAN Prince. He lives on a

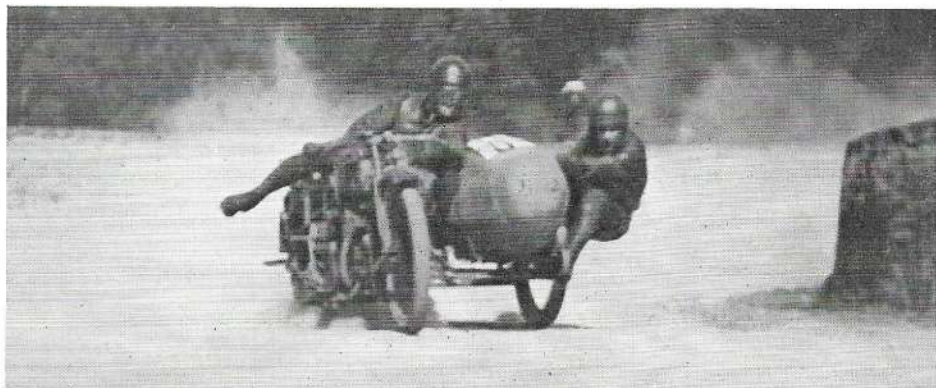
big estate 90 miles from the nearest garage and the only roads he can travel are very rough, full of holes and hummocks. Because of the distance to the nearest town, Lieut. Strauss has been frequently obliged to load up the Prince's luggage carrier to as much as 350 pounds weight. And the Prince has been faithfully and consistently hauling these big loads and her rider for this tremendous distance.

The only replacements on the Prince have been tires and tubes, handlebar grips, drive chains, sprockets, spark plugs and one speedometer. All the rest of the parts are the same as were in the machine when it was purchased by Lieut. Strauss. This is some record mileage for a single-cylinder and it shows the "built-in" quality that has made INDIAN famous all over the world.

### OUR COVER PICTURE

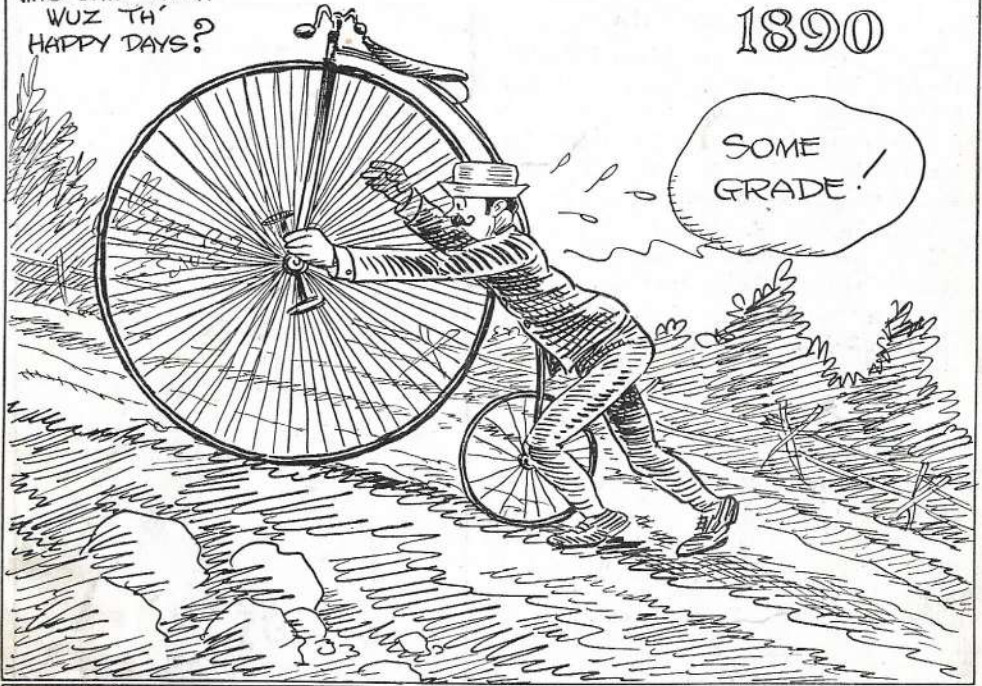
