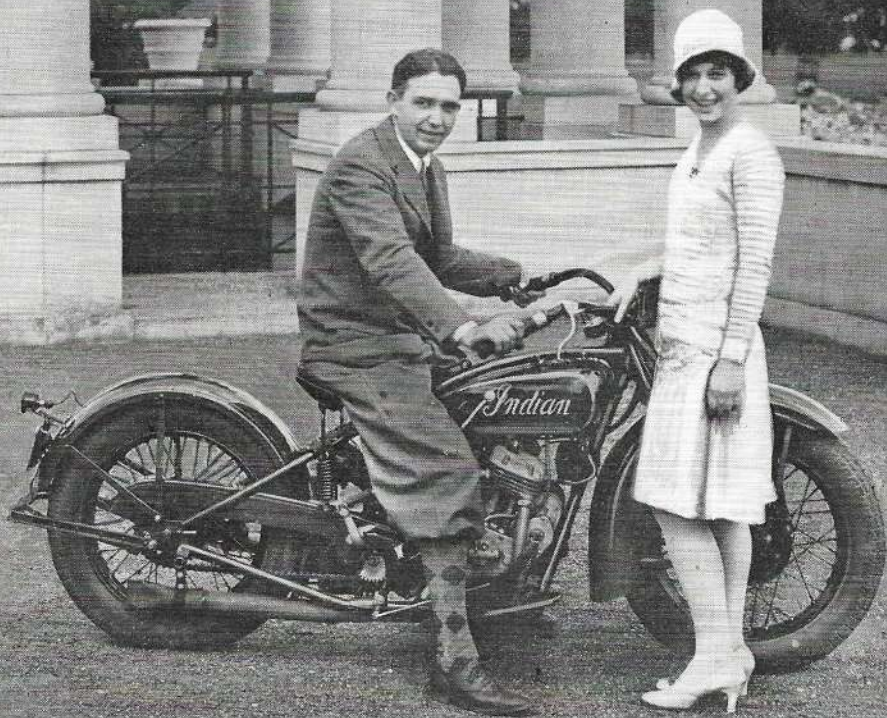
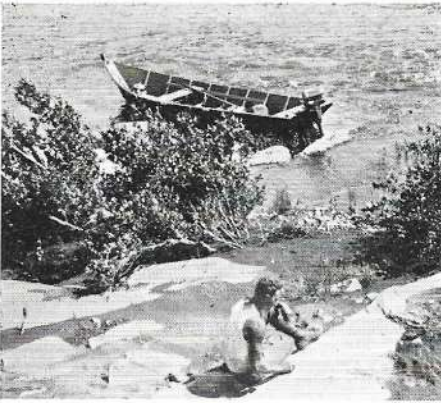

INDIAN Outboard Selected by Scientist for Dangerous Work

MYSTERIOUS rock carvings along the Susquehanna River, near Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, are being investigated by Dr. Donald A. Cadzow, noted archeologist, for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. These carvings can be reached only by water and because the river has rapids and shoals a special boat had to be constructed. This boat is driven by an INDIAN Outboard Motor, chosen by Dr. Cadzow as the powerplant best fulfilling the special and often hazardous operating conditions of his work.

The Susquehanna River was the main highway for war-parties and embassies of the Algonquin and Iroquois tribes of Indians

while the Delawares, who inhabited that part of the state made more use of forest trails. This part of Pennsylvania until after the American Revolution was almost all thick woods, with only foot-trails leading through it and many of these trails were "blazed" by marks on the trees.

The Algonquins and the other northern tribes who used the Susquehanna and other north-and-south rivers, chipped the rocks on the various islands to indicate the route to be followed. Dr. Cadzow is now investigating Indian markings on rocks along the shore.

Dr. Cadzow is the only man living who has visited every tribe of Esquimo on the North American Continent. He has been exploring and venturing into dangerous places for many years. Hence his selection of an INDIAN Outboard for this work in the rapids of the Susquehanna, is evidence of his faith in its unflinching dependability.
