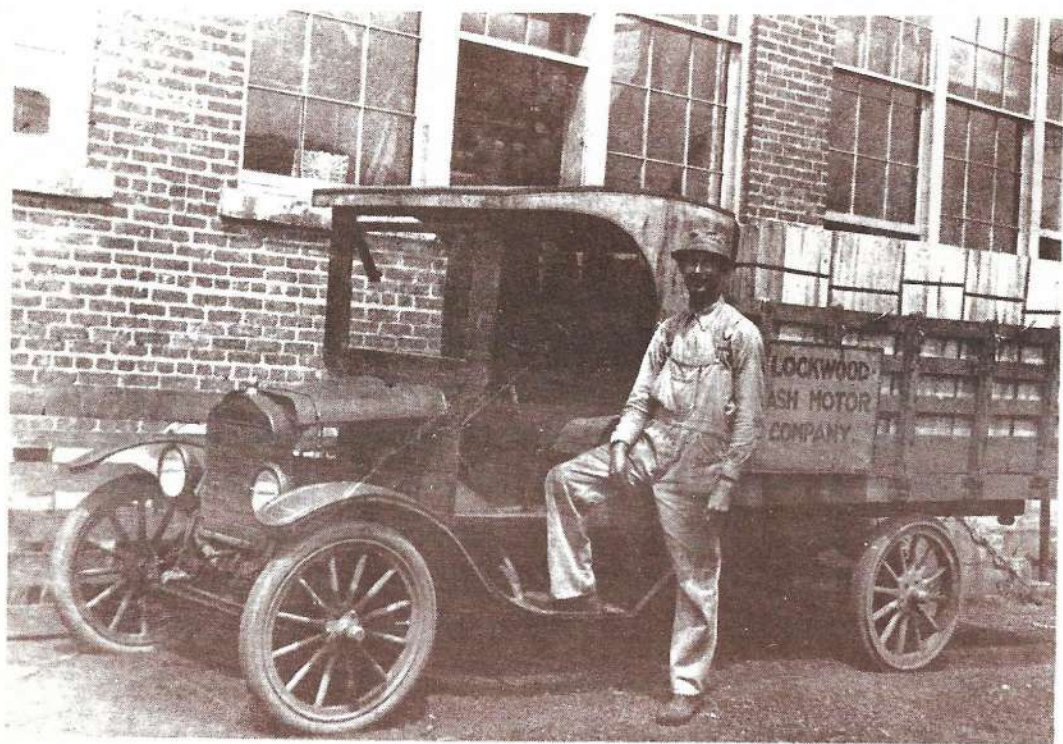
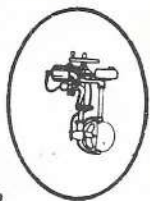

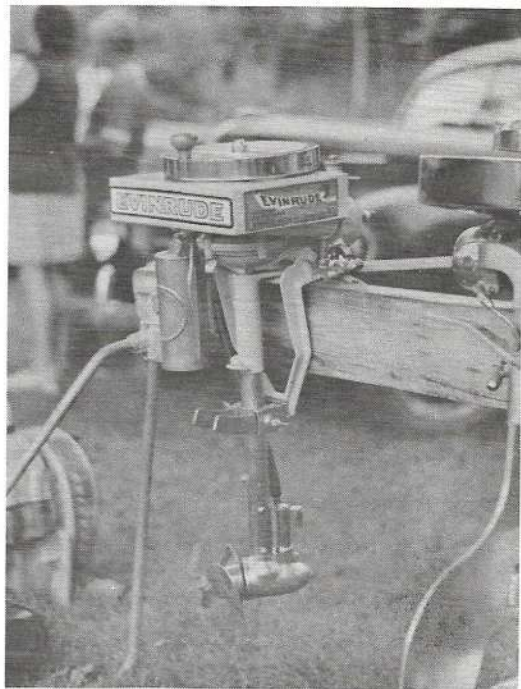

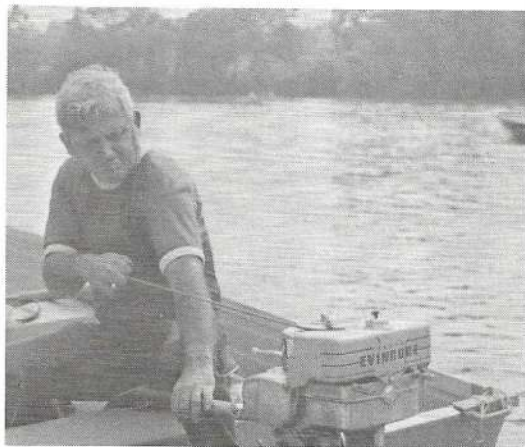

Ed Gera's 1911 Evinrude. The decal is original!

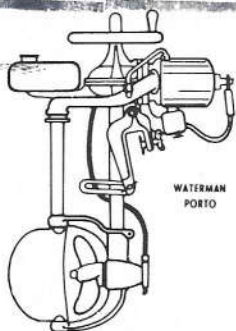
